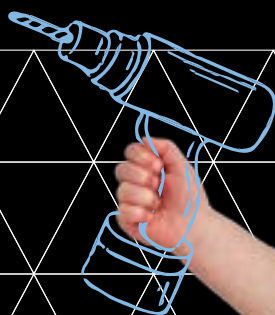
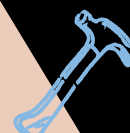
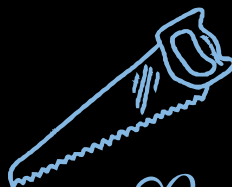

Churton Park School Enrolment Out of Zone Enrolment for Term 3 & 4 2026

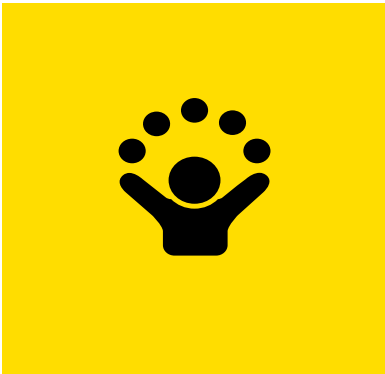
The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol "Out of Zone" students at Churton Park School in Terms 3 & 4 2026. Churton Park School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on the school website.

The Board of Trustees have approved 30 Out of Zone vacancies for Terms 3 & 4 in 2026. Applications are made on the official enrolment form, which is available at the school office or online enrolment on the school website. The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is Friday 29th May 2026 at 3pm. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on Thursday 4th June 2026. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three working days of the ballot being held.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signalled your intention to enrol your child, please contact the school immediately to assist us to plan appropriately.

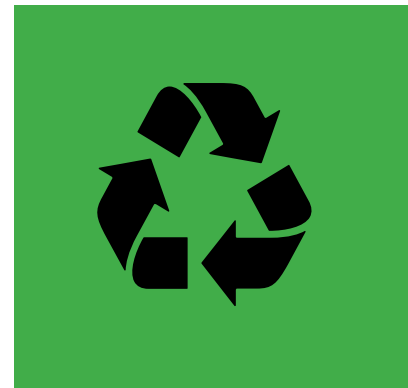

Our Environmental Footprint

This term, as part of our learning about "How the World Works" we are focussing on waste. We're on a mission to reduce Churton Park's environmental footprint by being conscious about how we use resources and what we throw away. Throughout the term students will participate in a waste workshop and the Greenies will lead some waste education presentations at assembly. We want our playgrounds to be a nice place to be by being litter free, so we have introduced a new way of running outside lunchtimes. Our students will sit in their house groups as we strengthen our identity as a community, school spirit and belonging. The older students will be stepping up as role models, sitting with and guiding our younger students to ensure their waste finds the right place. This creates a supportive environment where responsibility is shared across year levels. We

are also improving our recycling and composting systems. This is all part of students' curriculum learning, under Education for Sustainability, Science, Technology and Social Sciences.

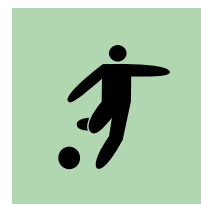

The Māori Electoral Option in election year

The Māori Electoral Option -Te Kōwhiringa Pōti Māori - is a unique choice for Māori about which electoral roll to be on: the Māori roll or the general roll.

Māori voters should have received an information pack in the mail by now about the roll choice for this year's election.

We have sent packs to 562,000 voters of Māori descent on the general roll and the Māori roll.

If you're Māori, you choose the Māori roll or general roll when you first enrol to vote. After that, you can change rolls any time, except in the 3 months before an election.

Your roll choice affects which candidates you can vote for but does not affect your party vote. It can also influence the number of Māori and general seats in Parliament.

If you're happy with the roll you're on, you don't need to do anything.
