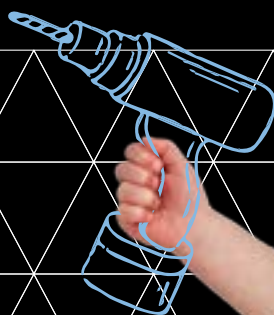
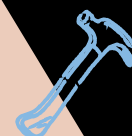
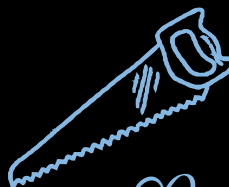

Churton Park School Enrolment Out of Zone Enrolment for Term 3 & 4 2026

The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol "Out of Zone" students at Churton Park School in Terms 3 & 4 2026. Churton Park School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on the school website.

The Board of Trustees have approved 30 Out of Zone vacancies for Terms 3 & 4 in 2026. Applications are made on the official enrolment form, which is available at the school office or online enrolment on the school website. The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is Friday 29th May 2026 at 3pm. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on Thursday 4th June 2026. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three working days of the ballot being held.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signalled your intention to enrol your child, please contact the school immediately to assist us to plan appropriately.

Intermediate School Information & Dates

Newlands Intermediate

Construction work at Newlands Intermediate is well underway. While this work is an exciting step forward for our school, it will create some disruption around access and parking.

During the construction period, we kindly ask all members of the community to refrain from using the school driveway, as this area will be needed for construction access and site safety. For daily drop-off, pick-up and weekend sports, please use the surrounding streets and avoid

entering the school drive during this time. Pinkerton Grove and Kingsbridge Place (off Colchester Crescent) both provide access to the school via walking tracks. Jay Street also provides access through Newlands College.

As a result of construction, our **Year 6 Open Evening will be postponed until Wednesday 13 August, 6–7:30 pm**. This will allow us to host families at a time when the school site is safer and easier to access. We hope this delay

will also allow new families to see the new buildings and learning spaces once they are completed.

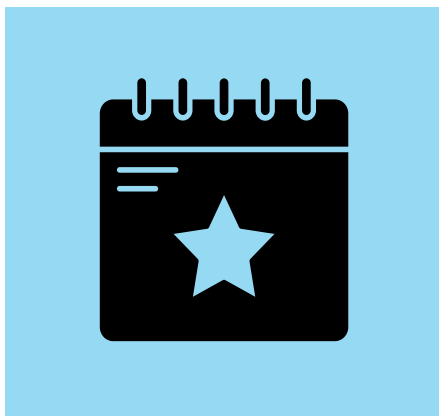

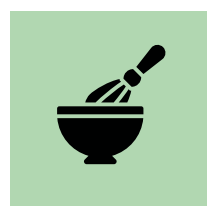
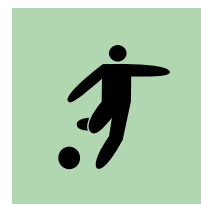

The Māori Electoral Option in election year

The Māori Electoral Option -Te Kōwhiringa Pōti Māori - is a unique choice for Māori about which electoral roll to be on: the Māori roll or the general roll.

Māori voters should have received an information pack in the mail by now about the roll choice for this year's election.

We have sent packs to 562,000 voters of Māori descent on the general roll and the Māori roll.

If you're Māori, you choose the Māori roll or general roll when you first enrol to vote. After that, you can change rolls any time, except in the 3 months before an election.

Your roll choice affects which candidates you can vote for but does not affect your party vote. It can also influence the number of Māori and general seats in Parliament.

If you're happy with the roll you're on, you don't need to do anything.

If you'd like to change rolls, you need to make the change by midnight, Thursday 6 August.

If you're Māori and haven't received a pack, it means we have an old address for you, or you're not enrolled.
