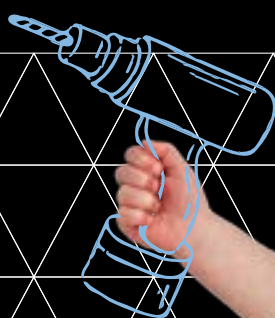
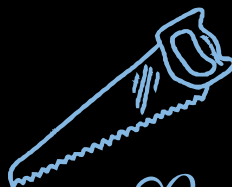

## Mid-Year Reporting Update

We continue with the next part of the mid-year report in this newsletter.

The next section will say "About this report"

This section contains an explanation of what the Progress Descriptors are:

- Emerging, Developing, Consolidating, Proficient and Exceeding (these are replacing the previous: working with, support towards, working towards, working at, working above).

The information below explains what each descriptor means and what it may look like in your child's learning.

### Emerging:

*Your child:*

- Is beginning to understand some learning ideas for their year level with a lot of support.
- Can sometimes use knowledge they've learned, but usually needs help to do so.
- Is making some progress in ways that are meaningful and aligned to their strengths and needs, with significant support.

### Developing:

*Your child:*

- Is starting to understand key ideas, often with some support.
- Can remember facts and use what they've learned in familiar situations, with a bit of help.
- With the right support, your child is making progress towards the expectation for their year level.

### Consolidating:

*Your child:*

- Is learning to use helpful techniques on their own to support their learning.
- Is getting better at remembering and using what they have learned.
- Is starting to use what they know in new and different situations.
- Can share their ideas and is beginning to talk about what they would do better.

### Proficient:

*Your child:*

- Can use helpful learning techniques on their own and knows how to use them well.
- Can use what they've learned in different situations without help.
- Can often use what they know in new situations.
- Can share their thoughts clearly and explain their reasoning.
- Often shares their ideas to build knowledge.

### Exceeding:

*Your child:*

- Shows advanced thinking by understanding tricky ideas, solving problems, making connections, and explaining their thinking clearly.
- Can link what they've learned in one area or situation to another.
- Can build on their ideas and show deeper understanding.
- Can use what they've learned in thoughtful and creative ways to understand more challenging ideas.
- Tests and challenges ideas to create deeper knowledge.

Because of the Refreshed New Zealand Curriculum, your child's achievement layout may look a little different this year. The new year-level expectations are set higher than before. Please keep in mind that your child's progress is being measured against these new, more challenging benchmarks, so their results may not directly compare to last year.

The aim for most students will be 'Proficiency' as the end-of-year goal, to meet curriculum expectations and be prepared for their next year of learning.

Next week we will break down what will be shared about Reading, Writing and Maths and explain what this means.

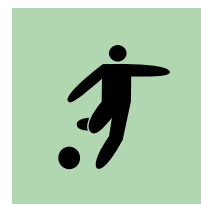

## The Māori Electoral Option in election year

The Māori Electoral Option -Te Kōwhiringa Pōti Māori - is a unique choice for Māori about which electoral roll to be on: the Māori roll or the general roll.

Māori voters should have received an information pack in the mail by now about the roll choice for this year's election.

We have sent packs to 562,000 voters of Māori descent on the general roll and the Māori roll.

If you're Māori, you choose the Māori roll or general roll when you first enrol to vote. After that, you can change rolls any time, except in the 3 months before an election.

Your roll choice affects which candidates you can vote for but does not affect your party vote. It can also influence the number of Māori and general seats in Parliament.

If you're happy with the roll you're on, you don't need to do anything.

If you'd like to change rolls, you need to make the change by midnight, Thursday 6 August.

If you're Māori and haven't received a pack, it means we have an old address for you, or you're not enrolled.

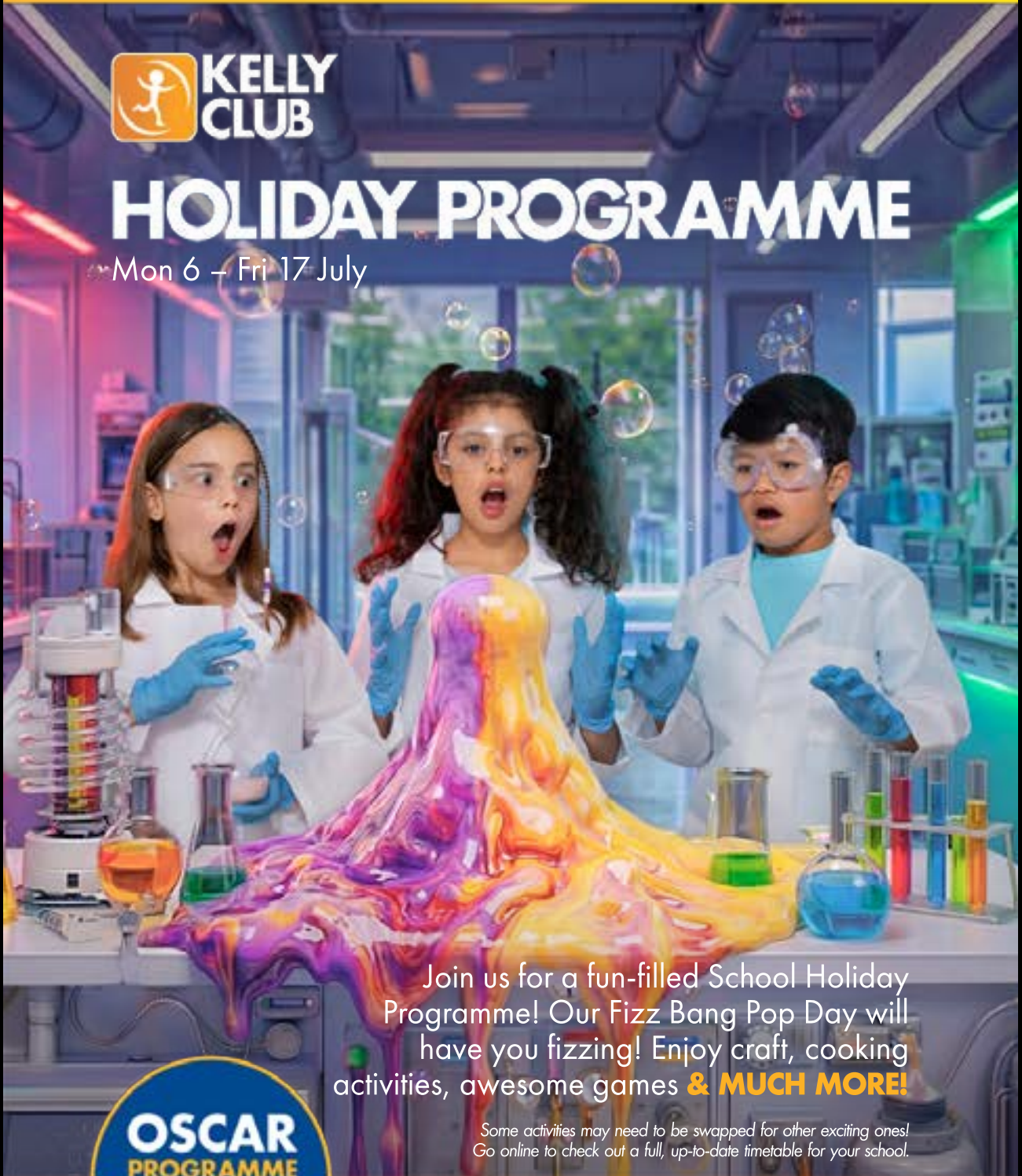
