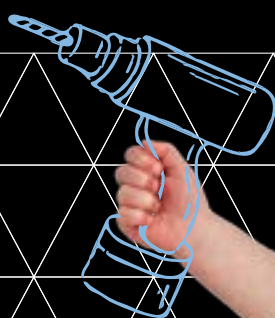
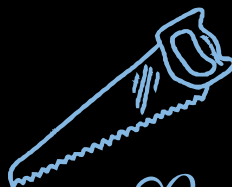

How We Handle Concerns

If you ever have a worry about your child's learning, well-being, or social interactions, please reach out to us. We take every concern seriously.

- **Step 1:** Start with your child's classroom teacher. They know your child best and can usually resolve most day-to-day issues quickly.
- **Step 2:** If the matter is complex or requires further attention, please contact the Hub Leader.

A Strict Policy on Privacy

We know that when incidents happen between children, parents naturally want to understand the full picture. However, we have a **strict confidentiality policy:**

Please note: We will never share personal information, consequences, or details regarding another child.

Just as you expect your own child's privacy to be fiercely protected, we must extend that same respect and legal protection to every student in our care. Our focus will always be on the steps we are taking to support your child.

Parent Code of Conduct

We model the behavior we want to see in our students. We kindly ask that all interactions between adults, whether via email, on the phone, or face-to-face on school grounds, remain calm, respectful, and constructive.

As part of our commitment to student wellbeing, please remember that only school staff are responsible for managing student behaviour on school grounds (before & after school) and during school hours.

- **What to do:** If you notice or have concerns about a student's behaviour, please report it directly to a staff member.
- **What to avoid:** Please do not approach or address the child yourself.

This approach ensures consistency, aligns with our child safety policies, and protects the wellbeing of all our tamariki. If you have any questions, please contact Matt Stanley.

OVERVIEW



You can raise concerns and complaints with our school verbally or in writing.



The school will assess and respond according to the nature of the concern or complaint.



The school will tell you how we plan to manage your concern or complaint, and let you know when the matter is closed.



HOW TO RAISE A CONCERN OR MAKE A COMPLAINT

Contact the following people at the school (verbally or in writing).

A staff member involved
(e.g. classroom teacher, head of learning area)

The principal
for serious matters

The board chair
for concerns or complaints about the principal

Another board member
for concerns or complaints about the board chair

- Concerns or complaints may be referred to a more appropriate person (e.g. senior staff, principal, board member).
- The school may ask you to put your concern or complaint in writing to help address the matter.
- You are welcome to have a support person (e.g. whānau member, friend, lawyer, union representative).
- Everyone involved is expected to respect privacy and confidentiality.



HOW THE SCHOOL MANAGES CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS

We manage concerns and complaints in a timely manner and seek to protect people's mana and dignity. We ensure:

- people are treated fairly
- those involved have the opportunity to be heard
- decision-making is unbiased.

The school assesses the concern or complaint and responds according to its nature and seriousness, and who is involved (e.g. student, staff member, principal, board member).



NOTIFICATION AND CLOSURE

We will tell you about how we plan to manage your concern or complaint, and let you know when the matter is closed.

After responding to your concern or complaint, **the school considers the matter closed.**

If you feel your concern or complaint has not been resolved after receiving a response, you may escalate the concern or complaint to the principal or board.

After the board has dealt with a matter, there is no further avenue for consideration by the school.

If you need help to understand the concerns and complaints process, please contact the school.

Mid-Year Reporting Update

As mentioned last week under reading , writing and mathematics there may be some assessment data.

PATs

PAT Reading Comprehension will appear for Yr 3-6 and PAT Mathematics will appear for Yr 4-6. Easttle writing scores will appear from Yr 2-6. If your child was absent, or is in a year level that does not do the assessment N/A will appear.

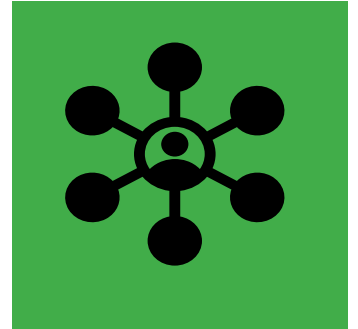
PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) - the results you will see are a single digit between 1 and 9 called a Stanine. A stanine is not a mark out of 9, nor is it a percentage. It is a way of showing where your child's learning sits compared to all other students in New Zealand in the exact same year level.

Stanine 1, 2 & 3 are considered below the national average.

Stanine 4, 5 & 6 are considered right in the national average.

Stanine 7, 8, 9 are considered above the national average.

It is important to remember that the stanine is a single test on a single day and reflects a snapshot of that. PATs were done in Term 1, 2026.



Easttle

Easttle Writing is an assessment tool used to see what your child can do and what their next steps in writing are - it is a diagnostic tool not a pass/fail test.

The results will say a number and a letter e.g. 3p

The number represents curriculum levels. These levels are from the old New Zealand Curriculum and represent

Level 1 - Yr 1 & 2

Level 2 - Yr 3 & 4

Level 3 - Yr 5 & 6

As we have moved to the phases in the Refreshed New Zealand Curriculum these levels are no longer being used and Easttle will likely be replaced by another tool. However in the interim it is still a tool for use in 2026.



The letter indicates the following

- B (basic) - the student is just starting to grasp the concepts of this level.
 - P (proficient) - the student is working securely within this level and understands the main concepts
 - A (Advanced) - the student has mastered this level and is nearly ready for the next one.

Smart Tool

We have decided not to include the SMART tool data for this Mid-Year report. During the initial rollout, issues were found regarding system setup and data consistency. Rather than include imperfect data, we are pausing its inclusion while the Ministry of Education irons out these early hiccups.

Towards the bottom of the reports will be a general comment. This is written by your child's home teacher.

The general comment may include some of the following

- : how your child is going generally in class
- : behaviours your child displays including our school values
- : how they approach their work
- : there may be an area for your child to continue to work on
- : some information about the other areas of the curriculum not already mentioned
e.g. Science, Social Sciences, The Arts, Physical Education & Health

The general comment is an opportunity to celebrate and reflect the year your child has had so far in 2026.

Bee Dress-Up Day - This Thursday



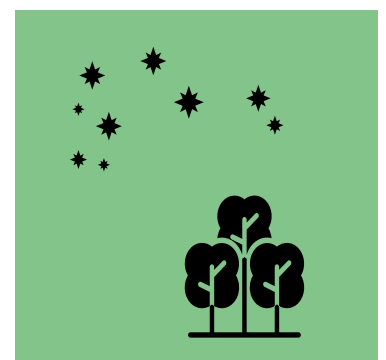

To help stop the spread of these bugs please remind your child to wash their hands after using the toilet and before they eat. If your child is unwell please keep them at home and if they have a tummy bug **please wait 48 hours after their last episode before sending them back to school.**



New Variable Speed Limit Signs

Have you noticed the new speed limit signs around the three school entrances?



Recently the Wellington City Council installed new variable speed limit signs outside schools in the Wellington region. This is part of Government's Land Transport Rule: Setting of Speed Limits 2024. These changes support safer travel for tamariki, whānau and the wider community during school travel times.

The updated variable speed limits are now in place and will apply during school pick-up and drop-off periods, as indicated on the signs. Wellington City Council will be working with NZ Police to enforce the updated speed limits within this zone.

The new speed limits will become operational when signage is uncovered in the next week.

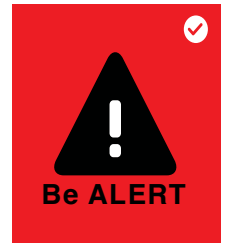
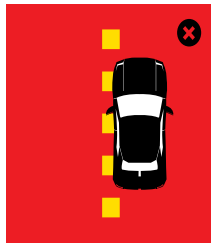
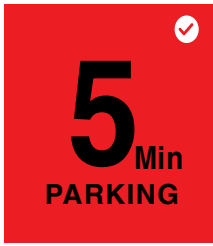

Keeping Our Streets Safe and Accessible



Every week we remind everyone about the traffic around our school gates, we ask you to observe the road rules & signs so we can keep our tamariki safe arriving at school and getting home. Every week we get emails & phone calls from parents & neighbours complaining about people leaving their cars or waiting too long in the drop-off zone, waiting or parking on yellow lines, performing u-turns and stopping their cars

in the middle of the road to pick-up or drop-off their children or parking over neighbours driveways. We have been in touch with the Council & Police and all three of our school entrances will be randomly monitored and infringement notices will be issued if you are not following the rules. We are sure that nobody wants to pay a fine or waste valuable resources - there is an easy way to avoid further action - let's all follow the rules!

Churton Drive

The area directly at the front of the school is a **Pick-Up / Drop-Off Zone**.

This means you can not park your car in this area from **8am - 9am & 2.45pm - 3.30pm, drivers must not leave the vehicle**.

If your child has not come out in the allotted time, please move off and let others pick up their children. By the time you have gone around the block your child will be there waiting for you.

If you would like to park your car and go to your child's class to collect your child, please use the parking space on the opposite side of the road where there is a **5 minute parking area** or park

further up the road and walk back to school.

Please do not park or wait on yellow lines or over our neighbours driveways (or in their driveways without their permission)!

We are doing our best to take care of your children safely so please do not be offended if you are asked by staff or our road patrol parents to move your vehicle.



Cranwell Street & Dormar Place

Cranwell Street and Dormar Place are very narrow at the ends where the school gates are located. The council have painted yellow lines around the cul-de-sac and these have been there for several years now.

Yellow lines mean you cannot for any reason stop or wait in this area. When cars are stopped on the yellow lines waiting for children this stops children having a clear view of the road to cross safely, stops cars being able to turn without reversing and

stops cars being able to leave the area safely. Please do not park or wait on the yellow lines or over driveways, and remember that you must park your vehicle 1 metre from the end of a driveway.
