# Statement from Ministry of Education/Minister to Support Schools with Reporting to Parents

As part of our focus on lifting student achievement we have introduced new, knowledge-rich and internationally-comparable curriculum this year for Maths in Years 0–8 and English in Years 0–6, and Te Reo Rangatira Years 0–6 and Pängarau Years 0–8 wähanga ako.

This means we are currently changing from the old to the new curriculum. We want to acknowledge that schools and kura will only have been using the new curricula from the start of 2025, which includes new teaching and assessment methods and content.

Because of this you could see a change in your child's progress or achievement compared to previous years which may be the result of changes in the curriculum expectations for your child's year level. If you have concerns or questions about your child's achievement, we strongly suggest you talk with your child's teacher or kaiako. They will also have used their own observations, classroom tasks and other tests to report on the progress your child is making.



# **Deprovisioning Chromebooks 2025**

## **Year 6 Students**

Every year when our Year 6 students move on to other schools we have a process to remove their Chromebooks from our school management system, so they are able to use their device at their new school - this is called Deprovisioning. Every Year 6 student with their own Chromebook will need to complete removing their work and any emails they have by following the instructions in this link. https://www. churtonpark.school.nz/our-school/ byod/httpstakeout-google-com/ Please make sure this process has been completed by Wednesday 31st December so our IT team can

remove the Chromebooks from our system and close down the email accounts.

# Year 4 & 5 Students Leaving CPS

If you are a Year 4 or Year 5 student and you are leaving Churton Park School at the end of the year you will also need to complete this process but you will also need to send a screenshot of your device serial number so we can remove the device from the system. If you do not send us your serial number this will cause a delay in having your device set-up at your new school.



## Chromebooks 2026



All Year 4 2026 students (currently Year 3 in 2025) are able to bring their own Chromebook for use in the classroom next year.

Agreement forms and Email forms will be emailed to all of these students shortly and paper copies will also be sent home with the children. Please do not send these forms back to school this year, instead please return them when

you drop your child's Chromebook off for set up in 2026.
Copies of the forms can be found on our website.
If you are purchasing a Chromebook for your child the drop-off dates for set-up are Wednesday 28th & Thursday 29th January 9am - 12 noon.

At the moment there are a lot of sales for Chromebooks. If you are looking at purchasing a Chromebook we do not have a preference for any brand. They can be any Chromebook (<u>not</u> laptop, e.g.Macbook or Windows) with a good battery life and a decent sized screen. # **Keeping Our Streets Safe and Accessible**













The area outside the school on Churton Drive is a Drop-off and Pick-up zone only from 8am - 9am and 2.30pm - 3.30pm. This means you are not allowed to park and leave your vehicle during this time. If the zone is full please do not wait in the middle of the road with your indicator on as this blocks other traffic and causes more frustration. Please drive farther up the road and park or go around the block and try again. We all want to keep our streets safe for everyone.

We've heard from many residents in Cranwell Street and Dormar Place about a recurring issue that's causing significant frustration: illegal and inconsiderate parking. We know that school drop-off and pick-up times can be hectic, but we're seeing an increasing number of parents parking on yellow lines or blocking neighbors' driveways.

This isn't just an inconvenience;

it's a safety hazard. Parking on yellow lines obstructs the flow of traffic, making it dangerous for children and other pedestrians. Furthermore, when driveways are blocked, it can prevent residents from leaving their homes for essential appointments, work, or emergencies. This can be incredibly stressful and frustrating for your neighbours.

Please take a moment to consider the impact of your

parking choices. We ask for your cooperation in keeping our community safe and accessible for everyone. Please make sure you are not parking on yellow lines or blocking driveways. By parking responsibly, you'll help ensure a smooth and safe experience for all of us.





Going overseas for the school holidays? Everyone travelling into New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration, including returning New Zealand passport holders.

Its FREE and you can do it on the online form or on the NZTD app.

If you're travelling as a family or group and completing multiple declarations, the <u>NZTD app</u> allows you to copy your travel details into another declaration, making it easier to complete multiple declarations for the same journey. The submitted declarations are then all easy to see within the app.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration collects travel, customs, immigration and biosecurity information and aims to improve the safety and security of New Zealand. It replaces the paper card you used to fill out on the plane.


