Measles Cases in Aotearoa


Recent measles cases linked to overseas travel have been reported in Te Tai Tokerau and Queenstown. Cases were active in the community while infectious and there is a risk of measles circulating there, and more widely in Aotearoa.

- Measles is very contagious and can make people of any age very sick.
- Watch for measles symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes and a blotchy rash.

- If anyone in your whānau has measles symptoms keep them home and contact a doctor or Healthline urgently on 0800 611 116.
- Vaccination is the best protection from measles. Check all whānau are immunised.


Measles immunity – Health New Zealand Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine – Health New Zealand Anyone closely exposed to measles who has not received two MMR vaccinations cannot attend their school | kura for at least eight days.



Changes to our Enrolment Zone

Recently the Ministry of Education reviewed our school enrolment home zone. This is the first review of our home zone since it was first put in place and a lot of the land to the north of our school was un-developed farm land. As a result of this review there have been a couple of changes to our boundaries. These changes have resulted in Prestbury Grove, off Winsley Terrace, being included in our zone and Farnworth Terrace and all streets leading off Farnworth Terrace being removed from our zone and included in Amesbury School's zone.

For families living in the streets that have been removed from our zone and currently have children attending Churton Park School nothing changes, the change will come when the child's siblings begin school. These children will have to be part of the out of zone ballot but because there is already a family member attending our school they will have a higher priority in the ballot system. 

We've heard from many residents in Cranwell Street and Dormar Place about a recurring issue that's causing significant frustration: illegal and inconsiderate parking. it's a safety hazard. Parking on yellow lines obstructs the flow of traffic, making it dangerous for children and other pedestrians. 
Benefits

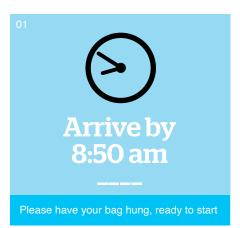

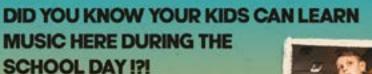
