'Bee in the City' Sculpture trail

Over the past three weeks our Year 6 children have been very busy painting our bee for part of the Bee in the City trail later in the year. The Yr 6 children have worked with Mrs Bernard and Miss Stempa to create a fabulous piece of art - this will be revealed during the trail and will come back to join us at Churton Park School after the trail which is very exciting.

The Bee in the City is a fundraising event for the Life Flight Trust. As part of our contribution to this we are going to have a dress up day and coin trail on Thursday 18th June. We are asking that children come dressed up in bee colours (yellow and black), as a bee or something associated with bees e.g flowers, a beekeeper or even a piece of fruit and to bring a gold coin along. They can give this coin to their home teacher and when we gather for a parade they will be given it back and can add to the coin trail.

Bee facts



Did you know that 1 in every 3 mouthfuls of the food we eat has been pollinated by insects, including bees? Bees get a hard time in schools because people are afraid of them, but bees will only sting you if they feel threatened. They are much more interested in gathering nectar and pollinating flowers as they go. Wasps are pollinator friends too, they just need a lot more space to stay happy. Next time you eat dinner, can you spot some foods that needed a pollinator to help them grow?

A beehive contains 20-80 thousand bees, which are 99% female and overseen by one queen bee. The bee we have painted for Bee in the City is a female worker bee. We have painted her with flowers to remind us where much of our food comes from. She is also surrounded by the colours from our school logo to represent our place in the world, Pukehuia, Ponga Grove, Tōtara Ridge and Kenepuru Stream, as well as Ngāti Toa as manawhenua.



Here is some more information about Bee in the City Wellington:

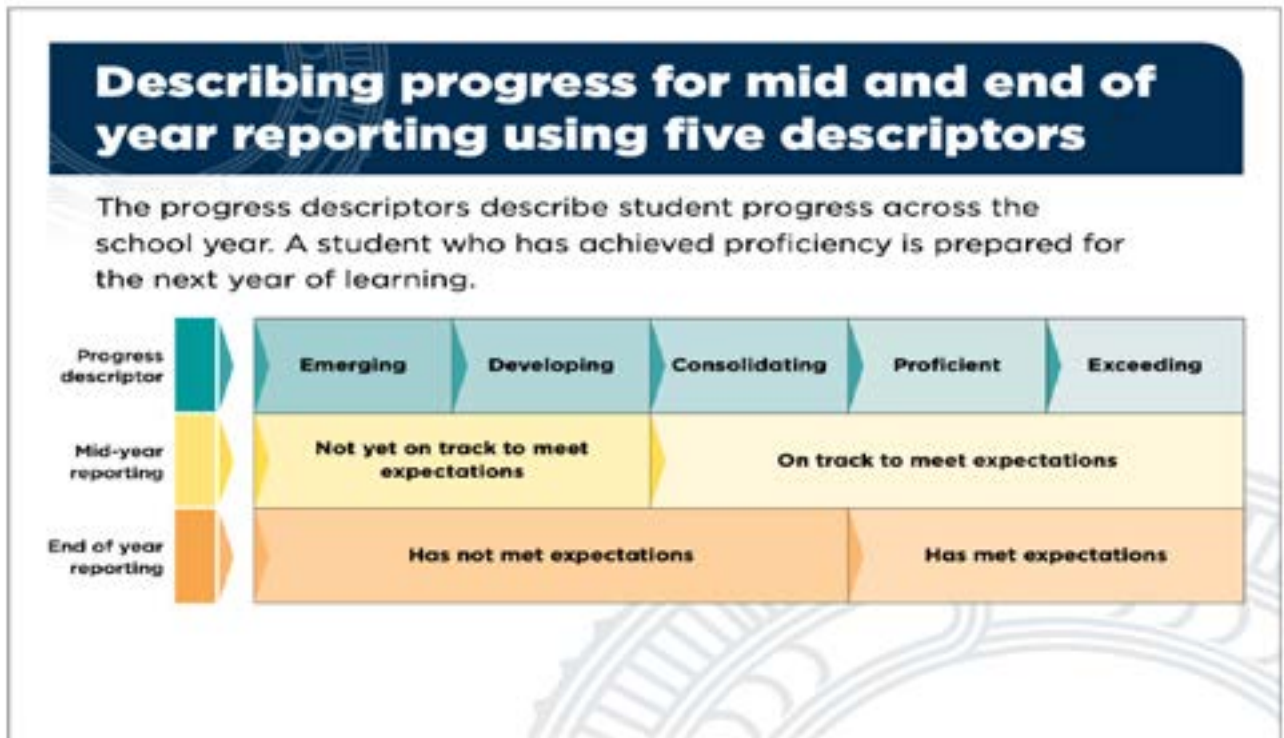
Bee in the City is a spectacular public art event that weaves its way across the Wellington CBD in spring 2026. 30 bee sculptures, each one individually designed by an artist and sponsored by a business, form a free, fun, family-friendly trail of discovery for local people to explore and enjoy. Schools, colleges and community youth groups from across the Wellington Region have designed their own medium Bee sculpture as part of the Learner Program. The medium bees join the art trail in the city's museums, libraries, galleries and leisure venues before being returned to the classroom as a lasting legacy. At the end of the event the giant sculptures are auctioned to raise vital funds for Life Flight Trust (Registered Charity No #CC24283), while the medium bees are returned to the schools that created them as a lasting keepsake. The event has been created by Wild in Art together with Life Flight Trust, and headline partner Mills Albert Ltd.

Mid-Year Reporting Update

Continuing on from last week a little bit more information about progress.



In the next section of the report information about reading, writing and mathematics will be shared. Teachers will make informed judgements in relation to each of these curriculum areas.

When teachers make informed judgements we are talking about a deliberate, data-driven process. It is not a "gut feeling" or a guess. Teachers gather different pieces of evidence over time to form an accurate picture of what a student knows, understands, and can do. They triangulate information from observations, conversations, learning tasks and data from assessment tools to give a well-rounded understanding of a student's progress and achievement.

At the top of this section will be the subject heading (we will show reading as an example) on the left in the box.

On the right is overall achievement (progress descriptor) and also effort in that curriculum area -the indicators for effort are needs improvement, inconsistent, consistent, strong, or outstanding

Effort: Strong

Teacher comment

Below this is the teacher's comment. This begins with a statement about whether your child is on track to meet expectations for their year level

e.g. (child's name) is on track to meet expectations or (child's name) is not yet on track to meet expectations

There will then be 3 comments in relation to your child's learning in this area - what they can do or are learning to do.

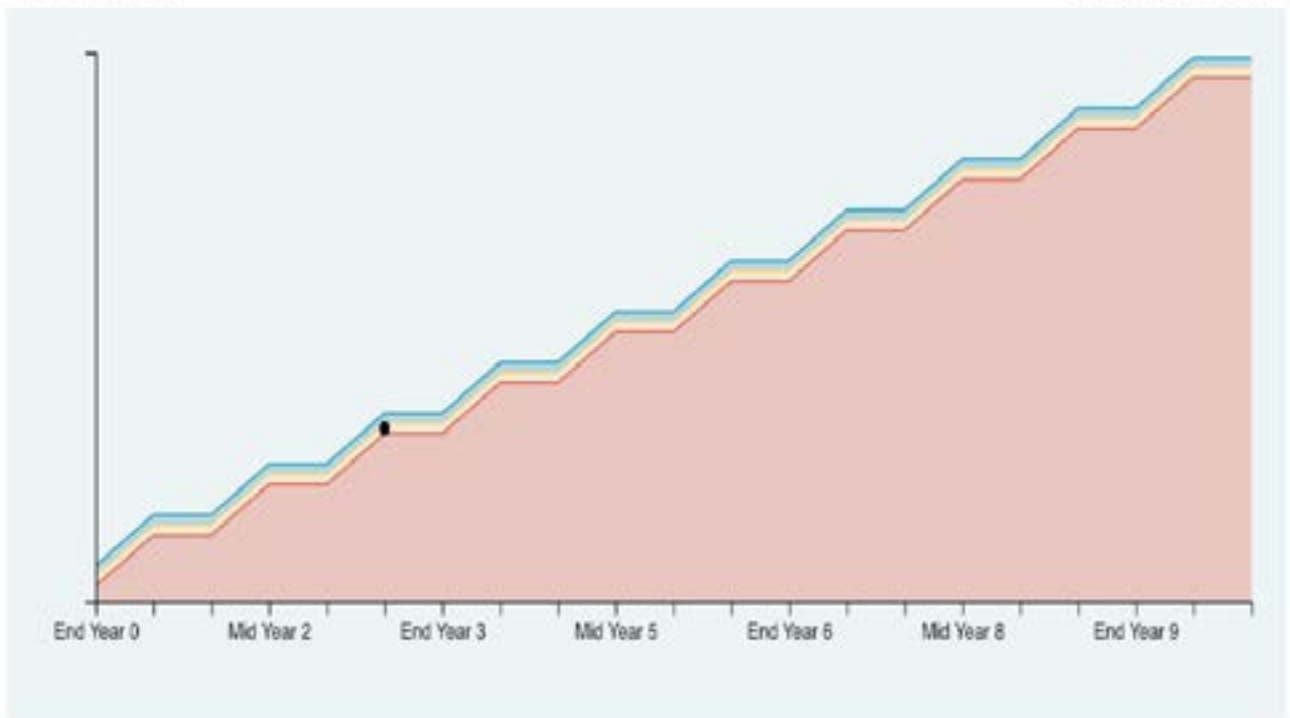
Following this there is a section giving 2 next steps for your child and an idea of how you can support your child at home.

The next section is a breakdown of learning areas within that curriculum with a slider which indicates where your child is (progress descriptors) for that specific area. Some sliders will not have a marker - this is due to this content being covered in the second half of the year. It does not mean that your child is not achieving in this part - their learning in this area is still to come.

The next thing you will see will be a graph - this will indicate the progress your child is making over time. As this is the first time using the new descriptors, there will only be a dot. However, when you receive the end of year report, you will see a line connecting mid and end of year achievement points and show the progress your child has made.

The final thing in this part of the report is any relevant assessment data your child has had e.g PAT test stanine marks.

This whole section is repeated for Writing and Mathematics in exactly the same way.

Next week, we will share more information about assessments, including what the numbers indicate, along with details about the General Comment section.



New Variable Speed Limit Signs

Have you noticed the new speed limit signs around the three school entrances?



Recently the Wellington City Council installed new variable speed limit signs outside schools in the Wellington region. This is part of Government's Land Transport Rule: Setting of Speed Limits 2024. These changes support safer travel for tamariki, whānau and the wider community during school travel times. The updated variable speed limits are now in place and will apply during school pick-up and drop-off periods, as indicated on the signs. Wellington City Council will be working with NZ Police to enforce the updated speed limits within this zone. The new speed limits will become operational when signage is uncovered in the next week.

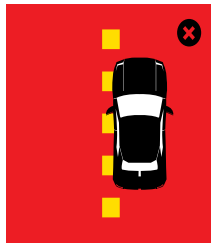
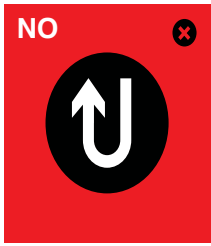
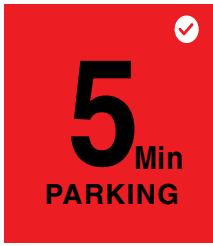

Keeping Our Streets Safe and Accessible



Every week we remind everyone about the traffic around our school gates, we ask you to observe the road rules & signs so we can keep our tamariki safe arriving at school and getting home. Every week we get emails & phone calls from parents & neighbours complaining about people leaving their cars or waiting too long in the drop-off zone, waiting or parking on yellow lines, performing u-turns and stopping their cars

in the middle of the road to pick-up or drop-off their children or parking over neighbours driveways. We have been in touch with the Council & Police and all three of our school entrances will be randomly monitored and infringement notices will be issued if you are not following the rules. We are sure that nobody wants to pay a fine or waste valuable resources - there is an easy way to avoid further action - let's all follow the rules!

Churton Drive

The area directly at the front of the school is a **Pick-Up / Drop-Off Zone**.

This means you can not park your car in this area from **8am - 9am & 2.45pm - 3.30pm, drivers must not leave the vehicle**.

If your child has not come out in the allotted time, please move off and let others pick up their children. By the time you have gone around the block your child will be there waiting for you.

If you would like to park your car and go to your child's class to collect your child, please use the parking space on the opposite side of the road where there is a **5 minute parking area** or park

further up the road and walk back to school.

Please do not park or wait on yellow lines or over our neighbours driveways (or in their driveways without their permission)!

We are doing our best to take care of your children safely so please do not be offended if you are asked by staff or our road patrol parents to move your vehicle.



Cranwell Street & Dormar Place

Cranwell Street and Dormar Place are very narrow at the ends where the school gates are located. The council have painted yellow lines around the cul-de-sac and these have been there for several years now.

Yellow lines mean you cannot for any reason stop or wait in this area. When cars are stopped on the yellow lines waiting for children this stops children having a clear view of the road to cross safely, stops cars being able to turn without reversing and

stops cars being able to leave the area safely. Please do not park or wait on the yellow lines or over driveways, and remember that you must park your vehicle 1 metre from the end of a driveway.
