# **Dogs on School Grounds**

Churton Park School values the benefits that interactions with animals can bring to our school community. We encourage appropriate safe behaviour when interacting with dogs so that students have a positive experience, and to reduce the risk of accident or possible injury.

For all dog owners at our school Visiting dogs must have no history of aggression towards people and must be fully trustworthy in a school environment. Owners bringing a dog on to school grounds must follow the guidelines below. Disability assist dogs and support/therapy dogs are welcome at Churton Park School and may be allowed inside school buildings when required.

Please understand that we will report any stray dogs to animal control, and will use our reverse evacuation procedure if there is a threat to the safety of our students.

#### Rules for everyones protection

- Dogs must be on a leash held by an adult, and kept reasonably close to the adult
- Dogs must not be left unattended on our school grounds
- If the dog is considered by the Council or any other authority to be a breed that needs a muzzle, the dog must be muzzled on school property
- Dogs are not allowed inside our school buildings.
- Dogs are not allowed to drink directly from school water fountains
- Dog owners should help educate our tamariki about how best to approach their dog
- Owners must remove any <u>mess</u> <u>left by their dog</u>

# **Keeping Our Streets Safe and Accessible**













The area outside the school on Churton Drive is a Drop-off and Pick-up zone only from 8am - 9am and 2.30pm - 3.30pm. This means you are not allowed to park and leave your vehicle during this time. If the zone is full please do not wait in the middle of the road with your indicator on as this blocks other traffic and causes more frustration. Please drive farther up the road and park or go around the block and try again. We all want to keep our streets safe for everyone.

We've heard from many residents in Cranwell Street and Dormar Place about a recurring issue that's causing significant frustration: illegal and inconsiderate parking. We know that school drop-off and pick-up times can be hectic, but we're seeing an increasing number of parents parking on yellow lines or blocking neighbors' driveways.

This isn't just an inconvenience;

it's a safety hazard. Parking on yellow lines obstructs the flow of traffic, making it dangerous for children and other pedestrians. Furthermore, when driveways are blocked, it can prevent residents from leaving their homes for essential appointments, work, or emergencies. This can be incredibly stressful and frustrating for your neighbours.

Please take a moment to consider the impact of your

parking choices. We ask for your cooperation in keeping our community safe and accessible for everyone. Please make sure you are not parking on yellow lines or blocking driveways. By parking responsibly, you'll help ensure a smooth and safe experience for all of us.

We planted peas to explore our topic of Growing. We learnt that plants need water, sun, air, and food from the soil to grow well.



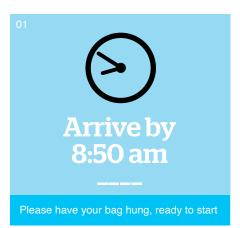
We have been taking care of our plants by watering them each day, and we are waiting patiently for them to grow.





Going overseas for the school holidays? Everyone travelling into New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration, including returning New Zealand passport holders.

Its FREE and you can do it on the online form or on the NZTD app.

If you're travelling as a family or group and completing multiple declarations, the <u>NZTD app</u> allows you to copy your travel details into another declaration, making it easier to complete multiple declarations for the same journey. The submitted declarations are then all easy to see within the app.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration collects travel, customs, immigration and biosecurity information and aims to improve the safety and security of New Zealand. It replaces the paper card you used to fill out on the plane.
