Explaining One Hour Per Day

What's happening

Starting from Term 1 2024, all children in New Zealand in Years 0–8 are expected to be taught reading and writing for an average of 10 hours and maths for an average of five hours in a typical week. We are currently reviewing our practices as a staff to ensure we are meeting these new government priorities.

What does this mean?

Generally there is already an hour a day of reading, writing and maths, so this will not be a big change. The new 'one hour a day' requirement has been designed to be practical and flexible. We will still be able to hold events like athletics days and school camps since the requirement is for an average amount of time in a "typical" week.

The National Curriculum outlines what your child should be able to understand, know and do as they progress through their school years. Teachers will continue to use the curriculum and teach in ways that best suit the learning. This includes using things like active learning opportunities, group work, investigations, practice, and consolidation activities. The 'one hour a day' requirement can be broken up into small blocks throughout the day. Your child's teacher will manage these to fit the needs of your child.

How you can help at home

To support the learning they do at school, you can help your child develop reading, writing and maths skills by:

- having your child read to you
- reading to your child and talking about books and stories
- encouraging your child to share what they think about a book, and being positive about the material they are reading or listening to
- letting your child see you enjoy books, audiobooks or podcasts
- encouraging your child to write, and talking with your child about what they are writing

- showing your child that you write for lots of reasons too, such as replying to an email, filling out a form, or writing an invitation or letter
- involving your child in activities where you use maths (for example playing games with cards or dice, grocery shopping, cooking, and DIY activities)
- encouraging your child to share how they solve mathematics problems (they may use different mental or written strategies to the ones you were taught)
- being positive about your child's reading, writing, and maths experiences, and praising their efforts.

Working Together

It is helpful to share your child's interests, languages spoken at home, and cultural practices with their teachers, so they can be included in your child's learning. You can also talk with your child or their teacher about their progress in reading, writing, and maths and discuss with their teacher ways you can support your child at home.

Notice of Paid Union Meetings (PUMs)

We have been advised by the NZEI (Teachers Union), that there will be paid union meetings for all teaching staff at the end of March.

The school is required by law to allow all union members to attend these meetings.

At the moment we are looking at ways to allow teachers to attend the meetings while creating the least desruption to classes.

We will advise more details shortly.


We welcome Yingfei and know that our tamariki will make her feel at home.

The University of Canterbury Exams - Years 5 & 6

The University of Canterbury is delighted to offer the annual Kiwi English, Mathematics and Science competitions for Primary, Intermediate and Secondary schools. The skills based Kiwi competitions are written by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students and closely align with the New Zealand Curriculum. The online competitions will be run in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3. The competitions take place at school under exam conditions. Parents/caregivers will be provided with an individual student report outlining student performance. All participating students will be awarded a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student in each competition. The cost for a student to participate is \$9.90 per competition entered. Safety is a choice you make





Our Safety Rules:

- The parking space directly outside school on Churton Drive is a 5 minute only parking in the morning and after school. If you wish to come into school with your child you must park elsewhere. The free flow of traffic through this area allows parents to bring their child/ren to the gate.
- U turns near the school entrance are dangerous for students using the footpath. Please drive further up the street to turn around.
- Parking on yellow lines or at the bottom of the drive for a auick drop off inhibits the view of the road patrollers. Please find a safe place away from the school driveway to pull in.

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 Make sure you cross your children on the pedestrian crossing, not down at the corner or close to your car. Also, please ensure that you as an adult also use the crossing after you have dropped your child at their class. This sets the right example to all our children.

- Please use the footpath alongside the main entryway driveway when you come into the school from Churton Drive.
- Please do not park over our neighbours driveways.
- We ask that parents do not drive up the drive in the mornings to drop children off for the Before School Care programme - it becomes guite a traffic jam when our school staff are also arriving in their vehicles.



School Hours -


